1 INTRODUCTION




Figure 1: Grade Chart

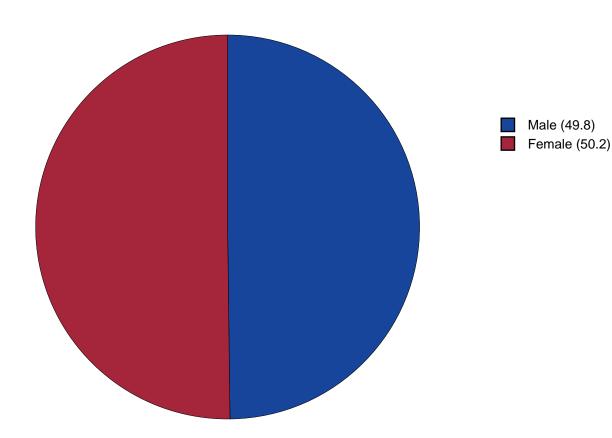


Figure 2: Gender Chart




Figure 3: Age Chart




Figure 4: Ethnic Origin Chart

2 PERCENTAGE TABLES

The following tables contain frequency distribution detailing how your students responded to each question on the survey. The tables appear in the same order as the questions on the survey. The tables include breakdowns by grade level as well as overall percentages. The *N* of *Valid* row is a frequency count of the number of valid responses to each question for each grade and overall. The *N* of *Miss* row is a frequency count of the number of invalid(marked more than one response) or missing (i.e. did not respond) responses to each question for each grade and overall.

For the questions that allowed more than one response (i.e. race, live with, etc.) each response becomes a separate table. If a student did not mark the response, that was counted as a NO response, and if they did mark the response, that was counted as a YES response. Since a non response is a valid response for these questions, the N of Miss will always be zero for these questions.
