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## **1 INTRODUCTION**

This report was generated from data collected on the 2008 Arkansas Prevention Needs Assessment Student Survey. This report contains basic frequency tables of all data collected and graphs on the selected demographic variables of grade, gender, age and ethnic origin. The graph on ethnic origin is represented as a bar chart rather than as a pie chart. This is because students were allowed to mark more than one response for ethnic origin as opposed to being allowed to mark only one response. The bars represent the percent of students who marked each of the ethnic categories.





Figure 1: Grade Chart





Figure 2: Gender Chart

# Ethnic Origin Chart




Figure 4: Ethnic Origin Chart

## 2 PERCENTAGE TABLES

The following tables contain frequency distribution detailing how your students responded to each question on the survey. The tables appear in the same order as the questions on the survey. The tables include breakdowns by grade level as well as overall percentages. The *N* of *Valid* row is a frequency count of the number of valid responses to each question for each grade and overall. The *N* of *Miss* row is a frequency count of the number of invalid(marked more than one response) or missing (i.e. did not respond) responses to each question for each grade and overall.

For the questions that allowed more than one response (i.e. race, live with, etc.) each response becomes a separate table. If a student did not mark the response, that was counted as a NO response, and if they did mark the response, that was counted as a YES response. Since a non response is a valid response for these questions, the *N* of *Miss* will always be zero for these questions.
